1. Foals

5. Sport Breeds
6. Spanish Breeds
7. Draft Breeds
8. Stock Breeds
9. Other Breeds
(Any Mixed Breeds, Zebras, Donkeys)
10. Collectibility (Vintage, Connoisseurs, Rare, etc.)
11. Fantasy Class
(Unicorns, Pegasus, decorator, or unrealistic)

Performance Classes

(Original Breyer Tack **or** Your Own Custom Tack Allowed)

1. Western Performance
2. English Performance
3. Costume (Native American, Arab, Cavalry, Parade, etc.)
4. Other Performance (Racing, Christmas, Harness, etc.)

Customs

There are 2 classes offered to show the Stablemate horse
you painted here today:

1. Painted by children aged 10 and under
2. Painted by ages 11 through 18

SOME RULES:

1. Entrants are limited to the age of 18 years of age or younger. Very young children are to be supervised at all times.
2. In Original Finish and Performance, there is a limit of TWO horses per exhibitor per class. In Customs, there is a limit of ONE horse per entrant. After placing your model, step away from the table.
3. Each horse may be shown in *ONE* class only. Choose the class that best represents the breed of your horse. If the horse is a mix of more than one breed, it should show in the "Other Breeds" class. If you're not sure what breed your horse is, ask the judge BEFORE the show.
4. Horses are not to wear any type of halter, blanket, leg wraps, or other equipment in Halter classes. All models must be out of their box.
5. Models are encouraged to have a 1" hang tag attached to one of their legs (available at office supply stores) with your name for identification purposes. This helps prevent someone else picking up your horse by mistake.
6. If you are showing in Performance, have your entries tacked up and ready to set up on the show table. Make sure your tack is fitted properly. You are encouraged to include documentation explaining exactly what your horse is doing in this class.
7. DO NOT RUN in the show area. Many models are quite valuable, some are irreplaceable, and you will be responsible for any damages that you cause.
8. DO NOT pick up anyone else's models! Most importantly, HAVE FUN!!
